Senate Update

There are seven motions to be discussed during the Senate Meeting at the Society Conference in Chicago (WE11). Please contact your Senators for more information on these motions and to express your opinion. It is important that they know their constituents' opinions on these important matters.

S-1202 Revision to CRF Document: This motion seeks to establish a solid reserve fund strategy for SWE based on the

recommendations put forth by the CRF (Contingency Reserve Fund) Task Force.

S1203 Revision to Procedure for Member Conduct: Seeks to expand the eligibility for ethics committee members, which is defined in the procedure for review of member conduct.

S1208 International Member Rate Change: Proposes to change the rate structure for international members to be aligned with other professional organizations.

S1205 Collegiate Section in Good Standing

S1206 Committee Charters

S1207 Deputy Director of Regions Vacancy

Fundraising Corner

Fundraising comes in many forms. If your Section has time, a large event can be a fun venue for raising travel or scholarship funds while also doing some team building. Smaller fundraising plans also have the potential to earn big dollars without taking a lot of time and initial investment.

Fun Run – Organize a community fun run. Offer prizes for the top finishers and t-shirts for all (work toward getting these items donated, perhaps from a local running store).

Halloween Carnival – Partner with a local pumpkin patch to host a SWE Carnival Day. Offer free labor to the pumpkin patch for the day and ask for a percentage of the profits in return. Setting up a hot chocolate stand along with games and face painting for the kids would create fun for the whole family.

Domino's Pizza or Papa Murphy's Pizza Coupon Cards – Both of these businesses offer fundraising coupon cards that never expire and worth significantly more than \$10 in savings. Cards are generally purchased for \$1-\$2 and can be sold for \$10.

Region J Council Business

Region J Bylaws – An updated copy of the bylaws were delivered to the Region J Council members on August 7th. This new version is required in order to maintain compliance with Society bylaws updates that have occurred over the past two years. Changes will be discussed in the August and September Region J Council meetings, with a vote to be held in person at the WE11 Region J business meeting.

Please see your Section Representative for details on the bylaws changes that are being proposed.

Region J Procedures - Over the past year, a sub-team has been hard at work revising our Region J Policies and Procedures document. This document is intended to detail operational procedures and document decisions the region has made regarding those procedural items.

Updates have been made for changes in officer titles and other administrative details. The Region J Travel Policy was reworded to coincide with our long-standing budgeting strategy, which separates the Collegiate and the

Professional allocations. No large procedural changes are being proposed as a part of this update.

The Region J Council will vote on the adoption of this revised policy at the September Region J Council Meeting. Please see your Section Representative for details on the Region J procedure changes that are being proposed.

Due to lack of quorum at the August meeting, voting could not be done on the Region J Procedures, FY12 Budget and FY12 Travel Budget Allocation. These motions will instead be discussed at the September Region J Council Meeting on the 19th.

Check with Alaska Airlines (alaskaair.com) and Hawaiian Airlines (hawaiianairlines.com) on a

periodic basis as they run specials from the west coast to Hawaii on a fairly frequent basis. This can often lead to a savings of nearly \$200!

Don't forget those frequent flier miles! Alaska Airlines will let you purchase a half-price fare (up to \$200 off) for only 20,000 miles.
